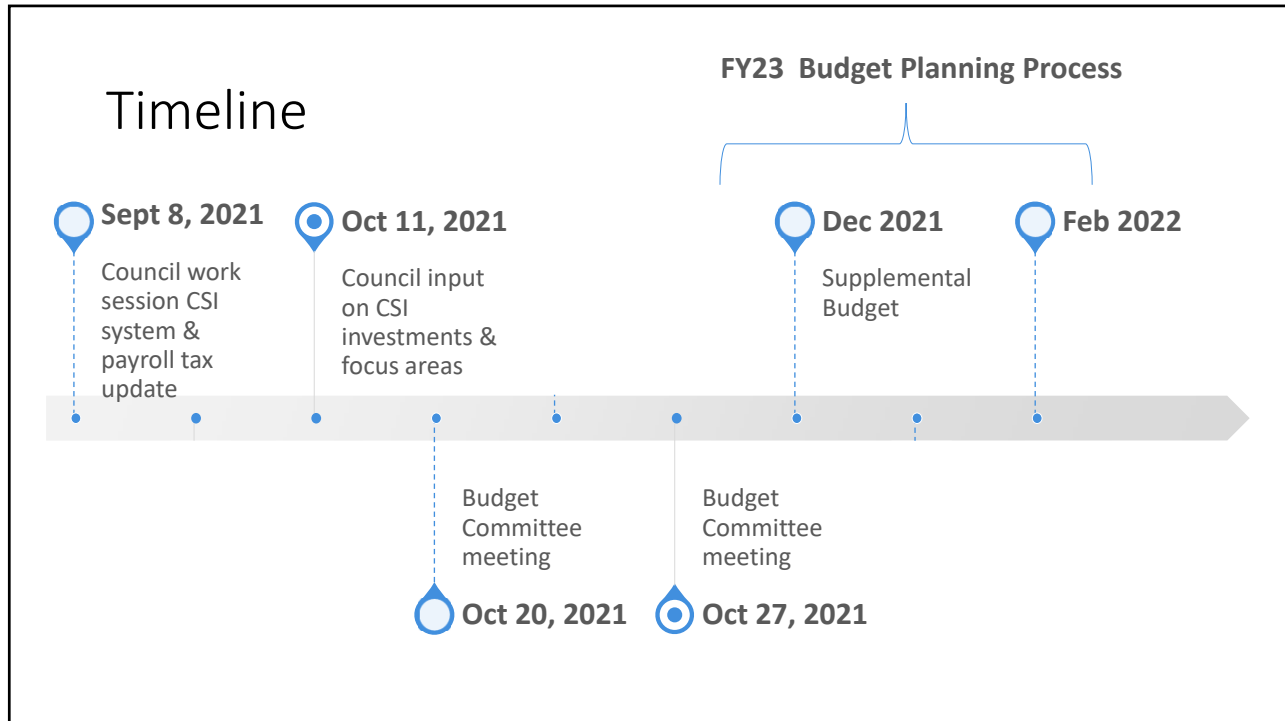

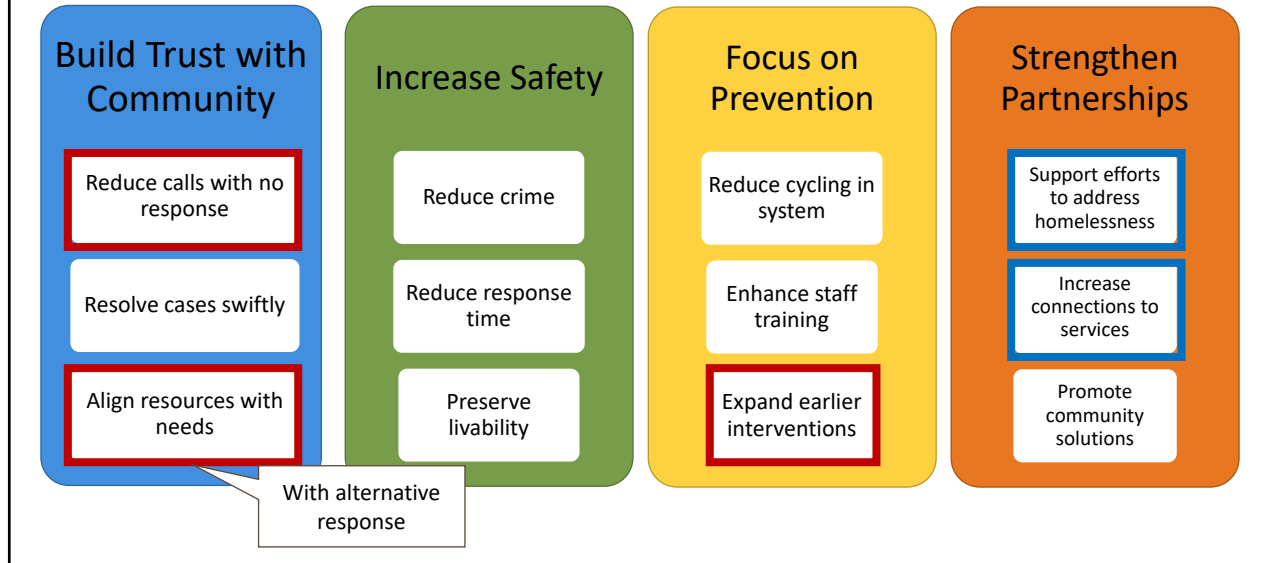
CSI Engagement Sessions – Key Findings
