Progress to Date

Construction Excise Tax Implementation

- Administrative rules adopted
- Development of web page and FAQ
- Integration with financial and permit tracking systems

AHTF Advisory Committee Activity

- Formation of Advisory Committee and five meetings held
- Explored possible uses of AHTF resources based on Council direction
- Unable to hold March meeting due to public health concerns

Resources Dedicated to AHTF

- Dedication of \$500,000 in General Fund dollars for AHTF through SB 1
- Receipt of over \$300,000 in CET revenue



Changing Landscape of Housing Needs

Prior to COVID-19

COVID-19 Impacts

Renters

Access to quality affordable rental housing as well as rent assistance

Increased need for counseling, support accessing benefits, and rent assistance to manage sudden loss of income

Home Owners

Access to quality affordable home ownership opportunities, downpayment assistance, and support to remain homeowners

Increased need for counseling, support accessing benefits, and foreclosure prevention assistance to manage sudden loss of income

Non-Homeless Special Needs Populations

Special needs populations need additional support as it relates to affordable housing

Seniors, people with disabilities, and those with underlying health conditions need additional support to protect themselves

People experiencing homelessness

Access to shelter, housing, and supportive services to prevent them from becoming homeless and to leave homelessness

Access to non-congregate shelter and resources so they may shelter in place. Support accessing benefits and housing



Potential Use of AHTF Resources

Renter Assistance

- Provide flexible resources to pay for outreach, counseling, benefit applications, and direct short-term renter assistance
- Work through area nonprofits and award through request for proposals

Homeowner Assistance

- Provide flexible resources to pay for foreclosure prevention counseling, benefit applications, and direct short-term assistance
- Work through area nonprofits and award through request for proposals

Support Residents of Existing Affordable Housing

- · Some residents of affordable housing are unable to pay rents which could destabilize projects and affordable housing organizations.
- Provide project-based assistance for rent gaps and to maintain resident housing stability
